
The November meeting was called to order at 7:02 pm on Thursday, November 4, 2010 at HobbyTown Tallahassee. Welcome Anthony, guest of new member Tyler Cole.

Theo Titus read the treasurers report. Motion to accept the treasurer's report was made, seconded and passed.

Geoff Lawrence stated the minutes of the October, 2010 meeting were posted in the current newsletter. With no questions or corrections, a motion to accept the minutes was made, seconded and passed.

Old Business:

- Mike Atkinson gave an update on the status of the electrical installation. Talquin Electric has completed the line and transformer installation and our electrician is awaiting favorable weather to install panels and outlets. It was determined that six circuits with three timers is the most cost effective configuration. There will be a seventh circuit for future use. The total cost will come out to be about \$7,773, well below the appropriated \$8500.
- Mike A. addressed the issue of night flying. Our County lease states we may fly from 9am to 9pm. Club rules state only



- electric aircraft may fly from 9am to noon. Mike recommends we amend the rules to allow electric flying from 9am to 9pm and maintain only noon to dusk flying for gas and glow aircraft. A motion was made to amend the field rules, seconded, and passed.
- Toys for Tots Fly In is set for November 20th, 10am to 5pm with a \$10 landing fee or a new unwrapped toy. Frank Bastos is working with the Marine Corp, Fred Schmidt has notified WCTV and Jim Ogorek will notify the Tallahassee Democrat.
- The HobbyTown Swap Meet is this coming Saturday. Frank will also be offering some specials on airplanes.
- The Flying for a Cure check was presented to the American Cancer Society representative and a group photo was taken.
- Mike A. reminded the club of the final Cross Country event of the year to be held on December 4th. It
 will be a small event, the field open to flying after the runners have cleared out.
- Theo states he will pick up the new fire extinguishers.

New Business:

- Fred Schmidt offered to donate \$100 to the club if the club would donate \$100 to the Killearn Lakes
 Home Owners Association in appreciation for inviting us to fly at Lake Monkey Business. A motion
 was made for the club to match Fred's donation and give the KLHOA \$200. The motion was
 seconded and passed.
- Theo will terminate the porta-potty rental since the County has installed a large one in the runners parking area.
- Jim Ogorek suggested we hold an informal Warbird Fly In on Veterans Day. It was well received.
- Jim Ogorek expressed concern over the trash barrel situation in the shed and discussed alternatives. It was decided to store the trash barrels except for special events. EVERYONE MUST PACK OUT THEIR OWN TRASH.

Protecting Yourself From Hazardous Materials by Chris Myers

If we caught our kids out in the garage sniffing paint or glue, we would send them to counseling. Yet, as adults we do this and call it modeling.

Last year I read an article about a man who was working with acetone in his house. After using it, he almost collapsed. Getting out of the room and lying down, he returned to normal.

When I look at the shelves in my work room, the chemicals stored there range from Balsarite to various spray cans, paint, lacquer, pesticides, etc., to CA to acetone, along with a couple cases of fuel. In addition to this, I use balsa and do a lot of sanding, creating particles to clog my lungs.

In the process of repairing and maintaining our aircraft, our hands come in contact with several hazardous materials. Our body absorbs these chemicals, and consistent exposure to them can be a danger to your health.

If you dissect our hobby, it quickly becomes apparent that we often spill fuel and CA on our hands. We sniff the paint and glue fumes and use grease and oil in our maintenance. It all gets on our hands. If you are an active modeler, you have a lot of exposure to hazardous materials.

Below is a list of a few items you may want to keep around the workshop. They should help minimize the risk of exposure to hazardous materials.

- 1. Get a fire extinguisher.
- 2. Go to an auto paint and body shop and pick up a good face mask.
- 3. Buy a small fan for ventilation. [Tech editor's note: A large fan is recommended. In order to move more

air, a small fan must be run at a higher speed and that causes some of its own problems. A large fan running slow moves sufficient air without making other problems.]

4. Work in a room that is properly ventilated.
5. Buy a box of rubber gloves.

Our hobby is great fun, but more than the propeller deserves some serious attention to keep you from being in harm's way.
