Take-off and Grow Event

The Academy of Aeronautics created a new program called "Take-off and Grow" whereby local clubs could apply for funds for training new members. Our Training Coordinator and Safety Officer, Mike Atkinson, applied for and received \$1000 as part of this program. He used a portion of the funds to refit our training fleet of models and support equipment. More of the funds were used to host a training event on Saturday December 11, 2021 following the conclusion of the pylon Racing discussed above. The event drew 65 training students, family members, and club members. Of this number 14 were students! A cookout was provided and a good time was had by all. The goal of the event was to recruit and train potential new club members. Judging by the crowd that was present, we should get a number of new members from this very successful event. After the training was competed, one of the spectators mentioned that he had a professional drone that he was willing to demonstrate for us. The drone is valued at \$150,000 and is capable of some pretty amazing autonomous flying. He could program in a course for the drone to track and it would then take-off, fly the prescribed route, and land by itself. He then proceeded to give a demonstration of some of the drone's capabilities. The range is on the order of 18 miles and the maximum height is around 20,000 feet! These are pretty darned amazing numbers! The last picture shows our Prez holding the drone at the completion of its mission. One of the pictures shows the antenna system used to communicate with the drone. The transmitter is connected by wi-fi to the base transmitter. Quite a system!
