It has been a very busy season so far this year. The AMPS Club in Homestead/Miami hosted their first heli funfly/contest. My friend, Nob Muraki, a member of the USA F3C Team, was the CD so several of us planned to make the trip. I had planned on going down on Thursday and returning Sunday. I started checking hotels and the least expensive I could find was \$259 a night, which would be a REALLY expensive weekend. Mike Goza from Texas, also a USA Team member, suggested we look at an Air BNB. Four of us ,me, Nob, Mike and Nick Maxwell, got together and rented one, Thursday to Sunday for \$1200, so \$300 a piece. Good Deal. 48 registered pilots.

I had not been to Miami in many years and had forgotten how flat it is. The AMPS field is big and has two runways in an L shape with shelters and electricity on both. The funfly flew off one and the contest off the other. This was my first contest with the new Reference fuselages and I was not very well prepared as the weather was awful for two weeks before I left. I finished

behind the guys on the world team and in front of the rest.

A little while later I was invited to a funfly in Nashville, or Nashvegas as they are calling it now. 34 registered pilots and a lot of fun. After doing this for 30 years, I know most of the guys that come to these so it's like a reunion. Flying was amazing and the BBQ was awesome. If you have never seen Nick Maxwell fly, go on Youtube and search for Nick. You've never seen anything like it. Nick and I have done 5 World Championships together and I have been his caller for the last three.

A couple of weeks after that was the Steve Helms Memorial fun fly in Huntsville Alabama. For those of you that did not know Steve, he was a founding member of Southern RC which kitted a lot of great pattern airplanes in the 70s. He founded Radio South but left to become the Hobby Manager for Futaba USA in California. I usually saw him at the NATS every year. He was also a really good helicopter pilot. Futaba moved their operation to Huntsville and Steve moved with it. He passed away several years ago but certainly has not been forgotten.

There were 38 registered pilots and the weather was great. Many of the guys off the World Team were there and we flew a lot. With that kind of talent there, it was easy to get helpful feedback to help get ready for the next contest which is in Nashville the end of June.

I will be leaving for Indiana and the US Nationals at the end of July, not to compete but to Judge. It is also the Team Trials for the next USA World Team, and is where the World Championships will be in Muncie in 2023. I will not be on the Team this time as I have been selected to be the US F3C judge. I have judged a lot but this will be my first World Championship. If you are interested in RC helicopters, plan to make the Worlds as the best of the best in both F3C (precision) and F3N (freestyle) will be represented.

After the NATS there is the IRCHA Jamboree which is the largest helicopter event in the United States, having as many as 1000 registered pilots. I would imagine attendance will be down some as gas prices are up and vacation time down. You will see everything new and exciting there including some awesome scale models like our own Sandy. Worth the trip if you have the time.


