

Wheel Chocks- Steve Warmath

Do you have a plane that just fits into the back of your vehicle without removing the wings or have multiple planes to transport without them rolling around and bumping into the interior or your other planes? I scratched my head on this to come up with an inexpensive rc airplane wheel chock solution. I looked back to my days on the USS Independence as a Catapult and Arresting Gear Officer to study

the types of chocks the Navy used on board to keep the aircraft stationary while it was being chained to the deck. Hey, if its good enough for the Navy, I'll start with that. One end of the chock was stationary and the other end would slide along the rail to fit different tire sizes. The other chock was movable with a spring loaded release/ locking pull pin.




What could be the cheapest most simplistic version of this concept I

could come up with that would accommodate both large and small wheels? Turns out the solution I opted for was to use 1/2" pipe insulation and 1/4" dowels. I cut the insulation into 5" lengths and the dowels 8" long. I sanded a point onto the dowels so they would not drag too much on the foam when inserting them. I then used an awl to punch a hole through the insulation to help the dowel to go through. Note: Pipe insulation has a slit in it to open for wrapping around a pipe. You'll want to punch your holes 90 degrees to that slit.

The foam insulation slides back and forth on the dowels to adjust for different wheel sizes. The wood to foam friction is perfect using the awl to punch the holes. For extra holding power, add two crossing rubber bands and attach to the dowels. For the price, I think I'll have to make two or three more sets.

If you want to accommodate even smaller wheels, cut the tubing in half and use small dowels or large wooden skewers. Use with flat side down with rubber band hold downs.
