Rain clears in time for club auction



Club Meeting News

This month's meeting was held as a video conference using Zoom. The meeting was called to order on Thursday March 18, 2021 by President Jay Wiggins at 7:00 PM with 31 persons signed on. Later, as many as 32 signed on.

Member Recognition – Mike Atkinson for his training activities; Joe Satterwhite for his work with the safety line painting, for storing donated models, and for setting them up for the auction; the Board of Directors for various contributions; Jay Wiggins for all his photo updates on the progress being made on the new pavilion; Randy Yarborough for pictures of the field; Gordie Meade, Jim and Dave Bussey, Ed Budzyna, Joe Satterwhite, and Mike McCarty for work on the new tables; Mike Atkinson for providing several EZups for the auction; Jim McKinnell for donating a new First Aid kit and for providing several helicopters for the auction; Jeff Owens, Jim Ogorek, and Sandy Jaffe for picking up rocks and trash in preparation for the laying of new sod; Rhett Boudreaux for procuring the food for the auction; Sam Varn for working on the new signage; Mike Picou for covote dropping removal; Theo Titus for field cleanup.

County Liaison Update – Jay Wiggins – Jay discussed recent work done on the pavilion. While things are coming together nicely, there are some items that the Club can do now that will further enhance the project. One item is additional sod for those areas near the pavilion that were not sodded by the County. A motion to purchase 18 additional pallets of sod was made, seconded, and passed. The cost will be \$4230. Jay reported that the Board of Directors approved purchasing a special grass seed mix for the areas to be hydroseeded. The usual mix contains grass that would aggressively overtake the grass used on the runway. The new mix will not. This cost was \$1900 and needed to be done

quickly in order for the hydroseeding to take root before the peak of the flying season. A discussion of other items needed for completion was held. An upper estimate of about \$3500 was made for various items (electrical work, additional tables, new signage, electric trimmer, charging station in the container for training aircraft.) A motion was made, seconded, and passed to approve these expenditures. The new container is scheduled to be delivered by April 14.

If any member encounters unauthorized fliers, they should inform them of the Club rules and policies as approved by the County and an effort should be made to encourage them to join the Club.

Vice-President's report – Rhett Boudreaux – no activities to report.

Secretary's Report – Jeff Owens – The minutes of the February Zoom meeting were printed in the Newsletter which was also posted on the web. They were approved as posted.

Treasurer's Report – Bill Ashbaker – The report was presented and approved by the membership.

Field Report – Gordie Meade - Kits for the tables have been constructed, painted, and installed by the crew listed above in Member Recognition.

Safety Report – Mike Atkinson – a safety line has been established to keep pilots, planes, and spectators back from the flying area. A transition to the new pilot stations will take place once they have been constructed. FPV fliers are reminded that they must have a spotter and that they must respect the same flight area rules as other model aircraft.

Training Report – Mike Atkinson – training is going well. The number of students is growing and more instructor assistance on Tuesday afternoons would be helpful.

Newsletter – Marcy Driscoll – keep sending pictures and reports of flying and building activity.

Old Business – none

New Business – A Club auction Saturday April 17, 2021. Four donated models from Bill Jones will be auctioned off. Members may also bring equipment for sale with a 10% commission going to the club (with a maximum of 15.) Details as to time, auction procedures, and how to sign up for lunch will be sent out when available. The lunches will be available for the usual charge of 5.

A discussion of flying times was held. The voting and discussion took part in two phases. After some initial discussion a motion was made by Dan Ouellet to see if there was enough support to continue discussing the topic. That motion passed by 85% and discussion continued. A motion to remove the restriction on wet fueled models described in item 6 of the operational rules was made, seconded, and passed by more than the required 55%. President Jay Wiggins will take the Club's recommendation to Leigh Davis for her approval. If approved, a second vote will be held at the next meeting in accordance with our Bylaws.

FAMU-FSU College of Engineering aircraft project – an update was provided by Jacob Pifer. A test flight of the aircraft will be held sometime in mid-April depending on construction progress.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:08 PM.
