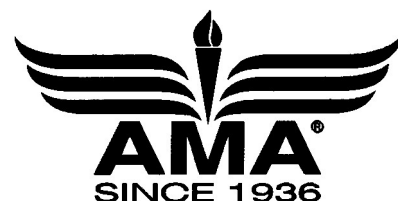

That's right! Just like RC Groups, RC Universe and other RC-related Web sites, we have our own forum. The forum was opened on May 12th. Almost a third of our members have registered and are discussing issues, asking questions and advertising items for sale. One member uploaded several nice pictures of our Memorial Day Weekend event. This forum provides an opportunity for club members to have on-line discussions with fellow club members on a variety of topics. It allows members to participate without email inbox clutter that results from "Reply All" which is unwanted by a good portion of our members.

The forum can be accessed from our club Web site

www.seminolerc.com . Click on "SRCC Forum" on the lower left side of the home page.

The forum has a calendar where all of our club meetings and events are posted. All of the school and running club events are posted so we can plan ahead and avoid traveling to the field on a day when we cannot fly.

As you browse the forum, you will discover several categories of discussion. And, more can be added at your request. Each category can be separated into several topics of discussion. Registered members can initiate new topics for discussion under each of the categories.

There are currently seven categories: "News," "General

Discussion,” “For Sale or To Buy,” “Technical RC Questions & Answers,” “Comments to the Officers,” “How Can the Club Be Improved?” and “How Can This Forum Be Improved?”

The “General Discussion” category is for discussions that do not fit into the other, more specific, categories. Feel free to share interesting items with your fellow club members.

List items for sale or that you wish to buy under “For Sale or To Buy.” You can even upload pictures!

If you have a problem with your airplane, helicopter, multirotor, radio or whatever, describe your issue under “Technical RC Questions & Answers” and your fellow club members may be able to help.

Take the opportunity to make suggestions or discuss concerns with your club leaders under “Comments to the Officers.”

Use “How Can the Club Be Improved” to make suggestions on field improvements, rules, etc.

Use “How Can This Forum Be Improved” to let us know

about difficulties you are having with this site or to propose improvements.

Here are a few hints for your first time. After you enter the forum, click on one of the categories. Then, click on one of the topics. You can read others’ comments and click “Reply” to add your own comments. You can also click “New Topic” to start a new discussion thread. Please only create new topics in the appropriate category. For example, avoid starting a discussion on club rules under something like the “For Sale or To Buy” category. To step back to where you started in the forum, click on the desired level at the left-hand center of the page under the horizontal menu ribbon.

You have to register, create a user ID and password and verify your email address to use the site. Do not be concerned. The information you provide is available to the club only. In fact, we already have this information in our club database. So, you are not revealing anything new.

This is the first time we have set up a forum Web site, so, there will be bugs and bumps until we get it ironed out. Please let us know if you have problems so we can fix them.

FMS Kawasaki Ki-61 High Speed PNP from Diamond Hobby



Scale looks and a top speed of close to 100 MPH!

If there's one thing which the good folks at **FMS** have proved in less than a year, it's this: These guys really know how to make an incredible, high-performance, all-EPO WWII warbird.

For their third outing, FMS has gone deep into the history books for a breathtaking rendition of the rarely modeled **Kawasaki Ki-61** fighter. Like the P-40 and P-47 before it, the Ki-61 denotes a real historic aircraft, namely *Red 62* as flown by Japanese ace Tembico Kobayashi in 1945.

This model packs the same wallop as its hangar mates with its 770Kv outrunner, 60-amp ESC (the other two models sport a 70A unit), three-blade propeller and four-cell li-po power. This combination is more than sufficient to propel the Ki-61 to a top speed of approximately 100 MPH (160km/h). Big, beefy, slop-free ball links add razor-sharp control to that awesome power.

As I'd pointed out in my review of the P-40, FMS has gone from an off-brand manufacturer with so-so quality products to one of the finest brands of EPO electric aircraft on the market in a very short time. The FMS Kawasaki Ki-61 High Speed PNP as designed with input from Diamond Hobby continues the tradition. It's a high quality model with high quality components and it has the extra added attractions of excellent control and insane - but oh so fun - speed. Should one wish to fly at a more sedate clip, the Hien will gladly oblige. This is a warbird which will see a lot of flight time and I give it the most enthusiastic two-thumbs-up I can possibly muster. It's just that great a model!
