Letter from the Editor- Michael Hupp

As I am sure everyone knows, November 11th is Veterans Day. Thanks to everyone who has worked on ironing out the safety issues we've been dealing with over the last couple of months. There have been a few tense moments, and a couple of bruised egos, but I think we've made great strides. There are still a couple of small areas that need addressing, but overall the officers have been very pleased with everyone's cooperation.

Real quickly, I want to address the subject of field courtesy. Over the course of discussing safety concerns, one thing became very evident. If everyone would think about his fellow pilots and put himself in their shoes before acting, most of the safety violations would have never happened. Use a spotter when you fly. Announce your intentions if you are entering the immediate space over the runway. And try not to intentionally fly in front of someone else's flight path.



Now let's move on to a different type of safety talk.....personal safety. This past Tuesday, I had the misfortune of brilliantly sticking my hand into the blade of my brand new Magnum .60. The throttle was at full speed, as I was approaching the needle valve with my left hand. As my thumb and index finger grabbed the needle valve, my index finger knuckle decided to investigate the space the blade was occupying. To make matters worse, it was a pusher prop, so I got the cutting edge of the 3 bladed prop. I've been flying RC aircraft for 38 years. You'd think I'd know better. Twenty-one stitches later, I'm not so sure. The moral of this story is: No matter how experienced you are, or how comfortable you get with these models, they are still very dangerous and we should all respect that potential threat and always follow safety protocol.

The inaugural float fly-in at Lake Monkey Business was a great success. Fred Schmidt did a great job in coordinating the event with the Killearn Lakes homeowner's association. If there are no complaints from any of the neighbors over the next couple of weeks, Fred is going to talk with them again about setting a few more dates for next year.

Mike Kinsey has announced a Warbird Fly-in November 21st. No landing fees, just good old fashioned bring your plane to the field and fly what you've got. It's been a while since we got all the warbirds together at the field, so we should have a great time. If you're working on a new project for the Toys for Tots event, this would be a good time to try it out. If I can bring myself to look at the culprit of my finger mishap by then, I may bring out the new pusher plane, the Flycat 40.

Finally, elections are scheduled for the December meeting. I believe all of the current officers have agreed to serve another year if there are no other candidates. If you qualify to be an officer (club member for at least 1 year prior to the election), and would like to be placed on the ballot, Geoff Lawrence (club secretary) will be taking nominations at the November and December meetings.

Afterbruner - From Memebers Like You

Pattern Flying – Getting Started Jeff Owens

In the two previous articles in this series I described various styles of pattern flying and the types of competition events in which they are flown. The next obvious question to address is how does one get started? What equipment is necessary and what options are there? To start with, one needs a plane, which will fly basic maneuvers such as loops and rolls. Ideally, one should have a plane that is fairly neutral in the sense that the three control axes are decoupled, i.e., you can roll, pitch, or yaw the plane without coupling. Many four-channel sport planes will fit into this category. Probably the biggest problem one encounters is roll-yaw coupling where the plane rolls with the application of rudder. Some pitchrudder coupling may also be present. Both of these can be removed using the programming options that exist in many radios today. So, one can start learning the basic maneuvers with something like an Uqly Stick (or one of the many variants available) or an Ultra Sport. With plane such as these one can learn rolls, loops, Immelman turns, split-S turnarounds, stall turns, and more. But what does one need for the next stage wherein you want to master specific maneuvers and learn the art of making small corrections as you approach the ideal maneuver? There are several routes, just as in other aspects of modeling – buy an ARF or build your own. In the following I will limit my choices to those that would be suitable for those aiming at the style of pattern flying practiced by the Senior Pattern Association. This is the style that was prevalent from the 1960s through the late 1980s before the "turnaround" style was introduced. However, one can always branch out after getting involved. But the SPA pattern style requires the least amount of investment in terms of equipment.

Let's look at the ARF approach first. There is no question that this is the fastest and most popular approach these days to most aspects of RC flying. Here the choices are rather limited. Tower sells an ARF version of the Kaos 40 designed by Joe Bridi. The Kaos remains a popular design and it is easily capable of the basic pattern maneuvers, especially given that today's 46 size engines are far more powerful than the older style 40s. The Tower Kaos 40 represents an economical way to get your feet wet in the pattern business and it is a great flying sport airplane, as well. Next on the list is the Intruder 90R by World Models. This is a larger plane and is suited for a 60 2-stroke or a 90 4-stroke. Many of these show up at SPA contest and they are quite competitive in all the classes. While costing somewhat more than the Kaos 40, it is a contest capable airplane. The third ARF in my list is the Graupner Kwik Fly III, which is marketed in the US through Hobby-Lobby. I recently purchased one of these for an Antique class pattern event (the planes must have been designed in 1967 or earlier.) The Kwik Fly is a Phil Kraft design with which Phil won the World Championship. I plan to use an OS 55 AX in it and I will report my experiences with it in a future article. I can say now, however, that this is a high quality ARF and, if it flies as well as it looks, I'll be very happy. That essentially exhausts the list of pattern ARFs of this type. While I was at a recent pattern contest in Atlanta I had the opportunity to talk with Jason Shulman, an international level pattern pilot and member of the USA FAI pattern team. I asked him what was needed to expand the level of interest in SPA competition and get more clubs interested in sponsoring contests. His answer was simple – more pattern ARFs. In fact, he was at the contest to examine various SPA airplanes with the idea of looking for one that would be a suitable ARF candidate. So, perhaps he will be marketing one in the future. I have also heard that Horizon Hobbies will be selling a Phoenix 7 ARF, perhaps by spring 2010. This is a Don Lowe design that was popular in the early 80s. In fact, the Phoenix series started around 1965 with the original Phoenix I and continues to today with the Phoenix 10. The "7" will make a great SPA plane.

The other alternative is to build your own. Several companies have started making foam wing and stab cores for some of the designs that were popular in the 70s and 80s and kits of some of these are also available. A great resource is the Classic Pattern Forum on RCUniverse. There one can find lists of classic pattern kit manufacturers, build threads showing some great techniques for building this type of plane, and discussions about many pattern topics. Another great web site is the Classic Pattern Plane list at http://www.trentonrcflyers.com/pattern/pattern1.htm

Here you can find hundreds of pictures of pattern planes of all types listed alphabetically. There is also a page devoted to the descriptions of the planes and links to many of the plans and construction articles. This is an excellent place to learn some of the history associated with these planes.

If anyone is interested in any of the topics I've mentioned in these articles, I would be happy to answer any questions you might have.
