Troy emphasized the need for a good quality, dependable motor and servos. 3D flying is most often flown in a stalled attitude. Any failure of these components end in catastrophic results.

A 3D airplane is set up with large control surface throws and a neutral CG. Troy explained the importance of adjusting engine thrust angle and angle of incidence of the wings and horizontal stabilizer.

The secret to success is to fly ahead of the airplane mentally and practice, practice, practice until muscle memory is error free.

Announce your intentions at the flight line. It is very important that other pilots at the flight line are aware of what you plan to do . Announce loudly and clearly when you plan to taxi, take off or land and in which direction. It is especially important if you experience some control problem. It is easy to forget to warn others if you are struggling with an emergency.

It is a good idea to let everyone know if you plan to do aerobatic maneuvers over the area beyond the runway.
