



#### Pylon Racing – Midseason Report

The weather dawned cool and breezy for the pylon races on Saturday, October 30<sup>th</sup>. Well, some of us thought it was downright cold, especially when the clouds moved in and the wind picked up. But oh, was it exciting!

Seven flyers raced and only two went home with unscathed planes. The wind caught series race leader Richard Feezel on the 4<sup>th</sup> lap of the first heat, putting him in the ground and out for the rest of the day. Jay Wiggins became the second casualty when he hit one of the pylons, unfortunate for him since this was the first day of races he's been able to attend.

As the wind built, the question became whether to even try for a second race. The five remaining competitors were game and decided on a single heat of 5 racers.

It was wild! I had trouble with my plane failing to arm so the race started without me and I joined in between the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> minute when the plane finally hooked up. About then, Geoff Lawrence hit the ground. In the last 10 seconds of the race, Chris Starnes and I got together in a spectacular mid-air collision. Spectators certainly got their money's worth!

For most of us, the gusty winds made it hard to keep our planes in the air, much less going in the right direction. Only Frederick Mursch managed completely consistent and fast laps around the pylons with Troy Emmett in hot pursuit. Race conditions really tested both planes and pilots, and results closed up the standings with ties for second and fifth places (see tables).
