Once again the meeting will be at the Tallahassee airport in the old terminal building it is a great place for a meeting and I hope more of you can make it this time. So, I will see you there at 7:30.


Here is the equipment update since our last meeting. The club voted on allocating up to \$5000.00 to purchase a new lawn tractor, a steel storage container, weed whacker, locks and miscellaneous items to secure our field and new equipment. After many visits to Lowe's, Home Depot, Jones Tractor, ProLine and Sears I found a lawn tractor with the features everyone agreed upon. I purchased a Craftsman DY4000 tractor with a 23hp Kohler engine, 48 inch cutting deck and automatic transmission additionally I was able to time the purchase so we got a 10% discount. Total for tractor and weed whacker was \$2041.00.

The steel storage container posed another problem. The first one I found turned out to be in poor condition and we decided to try to find one in better condition. After a multitude of phone calls, emails and Internet searches I found that all the containers were located in either Jacksonville or Tampa. The shipping on these units was really expensive ranging from \$1.50 to \$3.50 per mile this expense was compounded by the fact that it was difficult to inspect the containers and I was very uncomfortable with the idea of buying without seeing it first. After a couple of weeks with not much success Mike Kinsey saw containers at Cowarts in Thomasville that looked pretty good. I contacted Cowarts who turned out to be based in Valdosta, and made arrangements to go out and look at their containers so Mike and I took a road trip. Cowarts had a lot of containers and we were able to inspect 20 or more. Unfortunately, no one was there who could give us a price even though I had let them know we were coming. After a few more days I finally got Cowarts to fax me prices on the containers. The 20 foot containers in decent shape were \$1800 and a really banged up 40 foot was \$2000.00. This was really getting frustrating. A couple of days after I got Cowarts pricing Dr. Mike called to let me know there was a place in town that had some storage trailers available. We rode out to look at them and he had a 20 foot and 40 foot. Both were water tight but the 40 was in better condition and only \$150.00 more. We struck a deal and the container was delivered last Friday. The cost \$1750.00 was more then I hoped we would have to spend but it was certainly less then Valdosta and Jacksonville. Considering the savings on the mower we are in pretty decent shape. We are going to have an addition steel bar welded horizontally across the back doors and then we will have a pretty secure place for our field equipment. I have lots of ideas for additional uses for this container and I anticipate we will get a lot of value for the money. We do need to have a painting party and hopefully we can put the club name and logo on the side to dress it up a bit. We can discuss at the meeting this week.

After much due diligence Richard found us a new mower and weed eater (on sale - so how could he refuse?) for a total of \$2041.41. He also was able to locate {and acquire} a storage

container in very good condition for \$1750.00. I'm very pleased to see that we came in WAY UNDER BUDGET for those items so far. At the last meeting we had allocated up to \$5000 to be spent for those major expenditures and we (meaning Richard) saved over \$1200 of that allocation. We still have to purchase some trainers to replace the stolen/crashed ones so there will be more money to be spent but we are doing it carefully and with thoughtful planning.

I also finally received a bill for the lawn mowing done up through May 27 (\$195.00) and have paid that as well. Additionally, I have paid Mike Atkinson \$254.02 for fencing and other supplies he has purchased over the last couple of months.

So much for paying out....here's what's been coming in...DUES! I'm pleased to report that we have collected \$1370 in dues so far this month. A total of 22 members have paid up to this date. HOWEVER, we still have about 70 members on the roll to collect from. So let this be your REMINDER! DUES ARE DUE! Officially dues are due on July 1 and will be considered late on July 31 and flying privileges will be suspended.
